

This year our Shared Education Programme recommenced with P5-P7 classes participating in shared lessons with a focus on outdoor learning linked to the World Around Us topics. In this newsletter you will read all about what each class got up to and see lots of fantastic photographs. The aims of our shared work were:

- To build upon and sustain friendships and positive relationships in the shared classroom.
- To embed the core values of respect, responsibility, honesty and fairness through active participation in shared classes.
- To know what influences their views, feelings and behaviours towards others and understand that there can be more than one point of view.



Year 5 Shared Education Programme 2023



Fifty Pupils from Year 5 in Irvinestown Primary School and St. Paul's Primary School have thoroughly enjoyed their shared lessons this year. Throughout the year we focused on the curriculum area of 'The World Around Us' and the pupils took part in Outdoor Learning lessons linked with this area of the curriculum. We thoroughly enjoyed meeting together!

We were excited to spend a cold January morning together in Necarne. We enjoyed icebreakers, a scavenger hunt and exploring the grounds of Necarne to complete other set tasks before enjoying a picnic break. We played games together. A great way to start our Shared Education journey!





In St Paul's, we focused on trees and plants. Over a series of two days, we rotated around four set challenges where we used measuring sticks to estimate the height and age of trees. Using quadrats, we looked at what plants we could find in various habitats within the Forest School. We used iPads to research and record information on different types of native trees and completed Fact Files about these. Lastly, we used our artistic skills to explore the patterns and textures of bark and leaves. We were enthusiastic and focused on our learning.



In Irvinestown Primary, our focus was on Mini Beasts. We moved

around a carousel of activities encouraging us to explore Mini Beasts and their surroundings. These activities were completed throughout two days and we were grouped with friends from our own school and new friends too!





We explored the School Garden to find different Mini Beasts, looking closely using magnifying equipment and identification charts to classify them. We created Fact Files on the iPads using Pic-Collage to research and record information about less familiar Mini Beasts and shared our learning together.

We surveyed various habitats on the school grounds using quadrats to explore the types of

Mini Beast life found in each area and discussing together the reasons for this. We explored the work of the artist Andy Goldsworthy and created our own interpretations of his art using only natural resources and things found within the School Garden.





We were excited to spend a day together exploring the Marble Arch Caves. Many of us had not been to the caves before so it was such a great opportunity to learn about something so amazing in our local area.

We explored the caves with a guide, learning about the formations and how the caves were created. We also took part in 'Rock out with the Cave Crew', an activity based in the local Killykeeghan Nature reserve. This was part of the Cuilcagh Mountain Geopark. We were taught about the rocks in the area, local wildlife and features and formations of the land.





We have had a fantastic time this year learning together and making new friendships. We look forward to more shared experiences together in the future. ©

We headed back to Castle Irvine for the last of our Shared Education outdoor lessons. The lessons included creating animal habitats, sketching Castle Irvine and designing board games from the flora and fauna of the forest floor.
